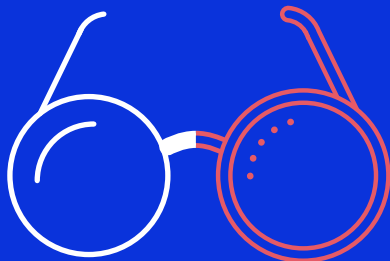

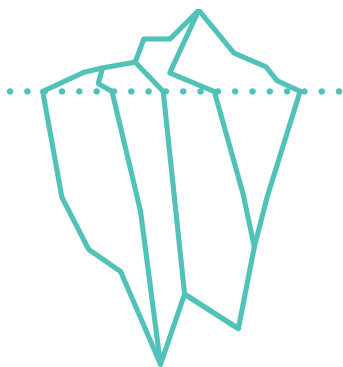
We have developed two curriculums, the Coaching Course Series for educators and the BE Programme for students.
